#### Respective responsibilities of the body and the auditor

The body is responsible for ensuring that its financial management is adequate and effective and that it has a sound system of internal control. The body prepares an annual return in accordance with proper practices which:

- summarises the accounting records for the year ended 31 March 2015; and
- confirms and provides assurance on those matters that are important to our audit responsibilities.

Our responsibility is to review the annual return in accordance with guidance issued by the Audit Commission (see note below). Our work does not constitute an audit carried out in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK & Ireland) and does not provide the same level of assurance that such an audit would do.

#### External auditor report (ACKE0102)

Except for the matters reported below, on the basis of our review of the annual return, in our opinion the information in the annual return is in accordance with proper practices and no matters have come to our attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.

Section 1, Box 2, the annual precept, does not agree to the figure notified to us by the precepting authority. The figures in Boxes 2 and 3 should read £6,370 and £5,537 respectively. All grants, including Council Tax Support Grant, should be shown in Box 3, as per the guidance notes on the Annual Return. In addition, the Council has not restated the prior year figures in Boxes 2 and 3, as reported in our prior year External Auditor Report, these figures should read £6,370 and £1,256 respectively.

#### Comment from FTC:

The auditor's comment above refers to the fact that a couple of years ago, the government changed the way that local authorities were funded for "council tax support grant". This means that rather than being automatically included within the precept we receive from CCC, it is (in theory) a separate item. However, it is all paid as one lump sum and the "precept" request from the PC to CCC is for just one figure. So technically, the auditor may be correct but to split this sum into two components is arguably confusing. There is no effect on the overall financial position – it is just a switch between two lines.
